- 1. Welcome and Introduction
- 2. Approved October meeting minutes by voice.
- 3. **Treasurer Report**—Aparna reviewed income and expenses, report distributed.

4. Committee Updates:

She has been trying to get to know the community and learn as much as she can and is thoroughly enjoying her work. She has met with parent focus groups and student focus groups. She is diligently watching enrollment #'s and is trying to get as much data and input to look at both the short term and the long term so we won't have to redistrict every few years. She also wants to make sure that there is a clear vision for the district as a whole. She then opened the discussion up for questions and addressed many topics, such as: alignment for the district while respecting the creativity and culture within each school, social emotional well-being of students, anxiety, redistricting, transportation, homework, recess, technology, class size, anti-bullying programs, and the math curriculum.
